Through Thick and Thin

In public environment applications it is extremely important that tickets are issued reliably and securely. A dispenser prevents users from having direct access to the paper until it is completely printed and has been cut off. Public printers often suffer damage caused by users pulling on paper that has not been cut, and the dispenser represents a countermeasure.

GeBE Elektronik und Feinwerktechnik GmbH, the miniature specialist in Germering near Munich, is offering an optional dispenser for installation on their ticket printer for extra thick paper, the GPT-4762 for 50-60mm paper width. This dispenser allows the presented ticket to be easily removed for a programmable period of time. Tickets that are not removed are retracted back inside. On the one hand, this process prepares the printer for issuing the next ticket. On the other hand, it helps to avoid the reading of sensitive information that has been left behind by a third party.

The GPT-4762 for extra thick paper prints with 160mm/s on paper and tickets with a thickness of up to 280µm. The robust transport motor will pull paper from rolls of up to 300 mm diameter. While tickets are transported they are curved only little. Alternatively, GeBE is offering a holding device for
